The Cerritos News moves to digital delivery in September

To our residents and faithful readers of The Cerritos News, thank you for your longstanding support of our community newsletter. As we informed you last month, The Cerritos News is transitioning from a print publication to a digital distribution model, effective in September. While we recognize the significance of this shift, we are excited to continue to bring you important information on our City through our email delivery service.

Key components of The Cerritos News will remain through separate digital newsletters. This will include City News, Library News, Community Services Program classes and activities, and Lifelong Enrichment classes and activities. Each of these newsletters will be shared via email at least the same frequency that they were delivered as a singular, monthly publication. With respect to City News, information will be shared more regularly to ensure timeliness.

To subscribe to these digital newsletters, please visit cerritos.gov and select the "News Signup" link at the top right of the page. You'll first need to enter your

login information or create a subscriber account. Once logged in, you'll have the option to subscribe by selecting any of the following topics: City News and Events, Cerritos Library, Lifelong Enrichment, and Community Services Program. After subscribing with your email, you have the option of logging back in with your phone number to enable text message alerts.

The decision to discontinue print delivery of The Cerritos News was made as part of the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 budget review process. To address budget constraints, the City Council on June 12 approved a recommendation to reduce select City expenses, including to end print delivery of The Cerritos News.

Classes and activities are provided by the Cerritos Library, Recreation Services Division, and Community Services Division. In addition to digital notifications of these classes and activities, patrons can register for and manage their schedule in the City's RACER registration database. See registration instructions at cerritos.gov/register.

The City of Cerritos is committed to ensuring our community is properly informed of news, events, and classes. We look forward to expanding our digital communications efforts to achieve this service. Cerritos City Council approves 2025-2026 fiscal year budget

The Cerritos City Council/Successor Agency recently approved a \$152.4 million combined financial program for the fiscal year 2025-2026. The budget focuses on providing quality City services while maintaining fiscal responsibility. The new fiscal year began on July 1, 2025, and concludes on June 30, 2026.

Earlier this year, the City Council laid out the priorities for the new fiscal year through eight strategic goals as a part of the Strategic Plan, which serves as the foundation for the City's future endeavors and budget allocations:

- 1. Enhance Public Safety
- 2. Attract and Retain a High Skilled Work Force
- 3. Assess and Maintain Infrastructure
- 4. Strengthen Economic Development
- 5. Improve Technology Resources
- 6. Focus on Fiscal Transparency and Sustainability
- 7. Improve Community Communications
- 8. Continued Excellence in Community Programming

The approved budget is reflective of challenges largely driven by broader economic headwinds that have created uncertainty and placed pressure on local revenues.

The City Council collaborated with City staff to identify significant cost savings that will accommodate impacts on the budget and ensure short-term needs. Furthermore, the City is committed to continuing to explore long-term solutions to raise revenues

Continued from page 1 and reduce expenses in future budget years.

Capital Improvements

Approximately \$23.0 million has been allocated toward capital improvement projects. Funds have been earmarked for capital improvement projects related to streets and highways, government buildings, water improvement, and other projects focused on the reinvestment in facilities and infrastructure throughout the community.

Legislative and Administrative

Legislative and Administrative operating expenses outlined in the budget total about \$4.6 million. This reflects the entire amount necessary to fund the ongoing operations of the City Council, City Manager, City Attorney, and City Clerk.

Community Development

The Community Development Department, which includes economic development, advance planning, current planning, and code enforcement, was allotted approximately \$8.9 million for its operations.

Public Works

Approximately \$47.3 million has been designated for the Public Works Department, which consists of engineering, traffic circulation management, parks maintenance, sewer maintenance, facility maintenance, landscaping, trash collection, recycling, custodial services, the City's Water Division, and the Cerritos Electric Utility.

Community and Cultural Services

The Department of Community and Cultural Services develops recreational and social programs across the City and provides contracted facility rental services. Roughly \$15.8 million has been allocated to the department, which oversees the Community Services, Senior Center, Recreation Services, and Cerritos Library divisions.

Community Safety

The Community Safety Division has been allotted \$23.4 million for law enforcement. The division implements public safety programs and oversees the City's contract with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.

Administrative Services

An estimated \$17.1 million was approved for the Department of Administrative Services, which includes the divisions of Budget and Finance, Communications and Marketing, Enterprise Services, Human Resources, and Innovation and Technology.

Theater

The Theater Department was allocated \$12.3 million for the operation of the Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts (CCPA). The Theater Department budget includes business management, marketing and management of the CCPA performances, operations and security, special event services, and box office personnel.

How to care for your new parkway tree

The City of Cerritos is asking homeowners for help maintaining parkway trees and the aesthetic appeal of the community. Caring for these trees is a community effort. Home and business owners take responsibility by regularly watering the parkway trees in front of their properties in accordance with Cerritos Municipal Code Section 9.75.120. With very young trees, deep watering is best because it encourages roots to grow downward, away from curbs, sidewalks, and driveways. Through proper care of newly planted trees, you'll make a positive impact on the long-term health of the tree and beauty of our parkways. Here is how:

- Encourage growth: Do not alter the staking. Tight staking can inhibit strong growth.
- Remove clutter: Keep the base of tree free of weeds and plants.
- Water often: Place a hose at the tree's base and turn on water slowly. This allows water to penetrate deeply into the soil, promoting downward root growth, which can help prevent sidewalk lifts and broken curbs. This is considered deep watering. Water slowly, 2-3 times per week in the warm months and once per week in the cold months. After one year, your regular irrigation system should provide sufficient water for your tree.
- Keep weed killer at least 10 feet away from the tree. New City trees are planted with plenty of fertilizer to last four to five years. For this reason, homeowners should avoid over-fertilizing their parkways, as excess nutrients can burn tree roots. Homeowners should also leave a 6 to 8-inch ring of soil at the base of their trees so that the trees won't have to compete with the lawn for water. This soil buffer also helps keep the nylon strings from weed-eating machines safely away from young trees.
