

City streets to receive upgrades

The Cerritos City Council recently awarded a \$5.3 million contract to R.J. Noble Company of Orange for street rehabilitation projects throughout the City.

The areas that will be upgraded include Bloomfield Avenue between 183rd Street and 195th Street; 195th Street between Bloomfield Avenue and Norwalk Boulevard; and Norwalk Boulevard between 195th Street and Del Amo Boulevard.

The scope of the work involves removing and replacing asphalt concrete, deficient concrete curb and gutters, installing traffic signal loops, and restriping lane lines, arrows, and stop bars. R.J. Noble Company will also replace sidewalk panels, trees, and curb ramps. The company will also adjust manhole covers to grade.

The project includes installing conduits to create a secure communications network aimed at connecting City facilities to support City operations.

The project is scheduled to begin mid-spring and conclude by the end of summer.

Mark the City's 69th anniversary at the Spring Fling

A dance recital, local talent and professional acts will be featured, along with gourmet food trucks offering food for sale. A fireworks display will be presented at 8:30 p.m.

Los Angeles County is presenting an UbeFest event at the adjacent Don Knabe Community Regional Park from 10 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. on April 26. As parking is limited, it is recommended that families carpool to the events.

Cerritos was incorporated on April 24, 1956 as the City of Dairy Valley, reflecting the agricultural focus of the community. The cows outnumbered the City's 3,439 residents by nine to one. The City voted on February 17, 1959 to become a California chartered city and the name change to Cerritos was made official on January 10, 1967. By 1972, Cerritos was the fastest growing city in California. In 2008, Cerritos received the nation's oldest and most prestigious award, being named an All-America City by the National Civic League.

Over the years, the City has become known for its top-notch services to residents, businesses and visitors, from its beautiful parks system and Cerritos Senior Center at Pat Nixon Park to its state-of-the-art Library and renowned Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts. Cerritos is also known for its quality schools and bustling business community, which includes the Cerritos Auto Square, Cerritos Towne Center, and Los Cerritos Center.

City holds Mayoral Transition, installs new Councilmembers

Newly elected members of the Cerritos City Council were officially seated and a new Mayor and Mayor Pro Tem selected during a special meeting of the City Council held March 26 at the Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts.

The City Council selected Frank Aurelio Yokoyama as Mayor, and Lynda P. Johnson as Mayor Pro Tem. This followed the installation of new Councilmembers Mark E. Pulido, Jennifer Hong, and Sophia M. Tse, whom voters selected in the March 4 Cerritos General Municipal Election.

Councilmembers Pulido, Hong, and Tse were joined by family and friends as they were officially sworn in. Administering the oath of office for Councilmember Pulido was California State Attorney General Rob Bonta, with the oath for Councilwoman Hong administered by City of San Gabriel Mayor John Wu, and the oath for Councilwoman Tse jointly administered by ABC Unified School District School Board President Ernie Nishii and Deputy Superintendent/ Chief Financial Officer Toan Nguyen.

The new Councilmembers succeed outgoing Mayor Naresh Solanki, Mayor Pro Tem Chuong Vo, and Councilmember Bruce W. Barrows. The three were recognized for their nearly 40 years of collective service to Cerritos during a Special Meeting of the City Council on March 19.

To access and sign-up for a Beanstack account, please visit the library's website at cerritoslibrary.us. Each participant must have a valid Cerritos Library card. Participants can log and track their reading progress in Beanstack and will need to complete their reading from June 2 through June 29. Children will need to log 30 minutes of reading per day and will earn digital badges for completing 210 minutes of reading each week. Adults and Teens will earn digital badges for every book logged (four books total).

Option 2 – In-Person Registration: Patrons can also register in person beginning on Monday, June 2, through Sunday, June 15. Patrons who register in person need to bring their valid Cerritos Library card to the Children's Art Studio in the Cerritos Library. Each participant must be present to register, or their valid Cerritos Library card must be presented. A separate form will need to be completed for each person who signs up to receive their reading log. Prizes and Programs: Children up to age 12 who read 30 minutes per day (210 minutes per week) during the program will earn a book prize and Summer Reading Program Tote Bag (while supplies last). Teens, ages 13 to 17, and adults, ages 18 and older, must complete four books, either fiction or non-fiction, in any language to earn the book prize and tote bag. Once every reading goal is met, you can visit the Children's Art Studio in the Cerritos Library to receive your book prize and tote bag beginning Monday, June 30, through Sunday, July 13. (Using the Beanstack mobile App, please show library staff the digital completion badge earned on your mobile device. If participants registered in person, please present completed reading log.)
