The ballot for this election features races for three Cerritos City Council seats, for full four-year terms, and two proposed Charter Amendment Measures regarding modifications to generally clean up the City's Charter and whether voters shall approve any future changes to the City's General Municipal Election date. Each active, registered Cerritos voter receives a vote-by-mail ballot for this election pursuant to State law. No return postage is required. Vote now through Tuesday, March 4, 2025, 8 p.m. Vote by mail, drop a ballot in a drop box at Cerritos Civic Center or Cerritos Park East, deliver to the Cerritos Elections Official at the Cerritos Civic Center, or bring your ballot and return envelope to vote in person at the Cerritos Civic Center.

City of Cerritos launches burglary abatement webpage

The City of Cerritos is strengthening its burglary prevention and response strategies with the launch of a new webpage to inform residents of recent safety initiatives and offer support resources.

The new webpage, cerritos.gov/burglarydefense, details recent actions by the City Council and Cerritos Sheriff's Station, provides actionable tips and resources for residents, and updates on the City's ongoing efforts.

Since November, the City has taken significant steps to bolster public safety in response to citizen concerns. The actions align with the City's Strategic Goal of Enhancing Public Safety, which includes the reclassification of dispatch calls to reduce response times and increased patrol staffing. In addition, the City has expanded the use of advanced technology tools such as Automated License Plate Recognition (ALPR) cameras and the use of drones in support of field deputies.

Cerritos residents are also encouraged to get involved by joining a Neighborhood Watch Group, signing up for safety alerts, and attending safety meetings. Learn more at cerritos.gov/burglarydefense.

Program fights fraud, notifies homeowners

In an effort to ensure accuracy and protect property owners from real estate fraud, the Los Angeles County Department of Consumer and Business Affairs offers an Enhanced Homeowner Notification Program, which notifies residential property owners throughout Los Angeles County when documents are recorded against their property.

Under the program, owners are alerted within five to 30 business days after certain documents are recorded on their property, including those that pertain to an ownership change, show loans taken against the home, or a Notice of Default or Notice of Sale.

Cerritos focuses on strategic goals

Enhancements to public safety, economic development, and investments in personnel and technology resources are among the long-term initiatives in the City of Cerritos' new Strategic Plan.

Approved by the Cerritos City Council on December 12, 2024, the Strategic Plan includes eight overarching goals and implementing objectives to guide the City's efforts in elevating services for residents and businesses.

Feedback received from a series of engagement sessions played an important role in the plan's development. Tripepi Smith conducted meetings with the City Council, staff, and community stakeholders, including two in-person community sessions. Cerritos residents and staff were also invited to share their feedback through an online questionnaire.

Upon analysis of staff and community feedback, in consultation with the City Council and executive leadership, the following Strategic Plan goals were established for Cerritos: 1. Enhance Public Safety 2. Attract and Retain a High Skilled Work Force 3. Assess and Maintain Infrastructure 4. Strengthen Economic Development 5. Improve Technology Resources 6. Focus on Fiscal Transparency and Sustainability 7. Improve Community Communications 8. Ensure Continued Excellence in Community Recreation and Community Programming For additional information on the Strategic Plan, the planning process, and to follow updates throughout its implementation, visit cerritos.gov/strategy.

Document copies are sent to homeowners to review for accuracy and legitimacy, giving owners the opportunity to take adequate steps to deal with an impending foreclosure or real estate fraud.

Interested property owners can opt-in for e-notification at dcba.lacounty.gov/portfolio/homeowner-notification-program/. The service emails owners within two days of a document's recording and follows up with a hard copy of the document in the mail.

Cerritos residential property owners are reminded that the City of Cerritos prohibits short-term rentals. Short-term rentals refer to leasing or renting a single-family residential dwelling unit (in whole or in part) for 31 days or fewer. The most common types of short-term rentals are vacation rentals and home-sharing rentals, which are both prohibited. The Sheraton Cerritos Hotel located in the commercially zoned Cerritos Towne Center is not considered a shortterm rental under the ordinance.

The ban strives to protect Cerritos residential neighborhoods from the noise, nuisances, added traffic and other adverse factors that can arise with short-term rentals. Appropriate enforcement measures will be taken against those who violate the City ordinance.

City saves drinking water by irrigating with recycled water

Committed to the preservation of the environment and conservation of water, the City of Cerritos has taken steps to conserve natural resources through a recycled-water distribution system. Cerritos irrigates more than 200 acres of City-owned property - including most parks, parkways, decorative fountains and medians – with recycled water.

The use of recycled water saves about 722 million gallons of potable drinking water annually and is billed monthly at about half the cost of drinking water. In addition to being used on City-owned property, the recycled water is used to irrigate schools, a county park, cemeteries, freeway landscaping, and some privately owned landscaped areas. Originating from industries, businesses and homes, the waste water is treated by a three-stage process by the Sanitation District before being used for irrigation.
